National Indicators	Status
Adult Participation in Sport	Current downward trend. Action plan under review.
Alcohol-harm related hospital admission rate	Currently no robust data to assess performance. Strategy and Action plan under review. Successful bid £40k from DH.
Obesity among primary age children in year six	OSC in final stage. Suite of programmes identified in response. First tranche (3) to Be Healthy Board & Children's Trust, recommended for commission. Care pathways identified & agreed with clinicians.

U18 Conception	Reduction in under 18 conception rate -16% . Chlamydia screening achieved target 17% 15-24 yr olds. Action plan under review.
All age all cause mortality	Subject to performance of other Nis.
Mortality rate from all circulatory diseases at ages u75	Exceeded target in 08/09. Peterborough is in line to meet the national target of reducing the death rates from cardiovascular diseases in people under 75 years by 40% by 2010.
16+ smoking rate prevalence	Exceeded target 08/09. pilot contract with dentists launched. Workforce development programme with SHA (McKinsey) identified smoking cessation 'champions' in Acute Trust.

NI 112 Under 18 conception rate

- January report – status RED and achieved target in March as anticipated.
- Data subject to 14 month delay
- Regional rate is 33.1 and national rate is 41.7
- 16/24 wards have TP rates above national average.
- Target for 09/10 is probably unachievable and action plan under review.

NI 121 mortality rate from all circulatory diseases at ages under 35

- A vascular risk assessment programme is being rolled out in the GP practices with eventual roll out of a vascular checks programme for people 40-74 years.
- Additionally, a coronary heart disease (CHD) health equity audit is being carried out to ascertain where there are gaps in CHD services with a view to addressing them.
- In Peterborough, if mortality from CHD is reduced, we will achieve our goal as CHD is the predominant cause of mortality amongst all circulatory diseases

NI 123 16+ Smoking Prevalence

- Status now GREEN as target exceeded (reported AMBER at end of March 09 as delay in data collection).
- Quit rate improved 8%
- Target for 09/10 seasonally adjusted so anticipate status GREEN throughout the year.
- Workforce development programme has identified key staff in Midwifery and Acute wards and recruited approx 20 staff to deliver stop smoking advice to their patients.
