**Item 7. Making a Positive Contribution**

This item was brought forward on the agenda. It was reported that raising the profile of disability is being continually worked on and that it was not just the priority of the Local Agreement. Discussion on how a platform into inter community working could be developed and although funding has been agreed for this piece of work the amount has not been decided Brian Tyler asked for help from GPP as a whole for contacts to help with advice on film production etc.

DR informed BT the council was running Peterborough's Got Talent auditions and contact might result in resources being shared.

It was suggested that the LAA had not included disability but CG assured the committee it was not an oversight and disabled people and representatives from the field of disability were included in all discussions and forums. It was felt that GPP should promote its lead on culture issues through the magazine, website etc. Representatives from the field of disability should be on the board as it was felt that there was huge benefits' talking to disabled people – it was also noted that there is 60% of the population who have a disability. DR suggested there should be a workshop to look at whether all priorities are being covered.

**Item 3 Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy**

In Karen Kibblewhite's absence Sue Mitchell gave a presentation on the delivery strategy of the 2009/10 Action Plan.

It was felt the governance was not clear. Treatment has been very successful and we have good integrated pathways.

All GP's have signed up to D.E.S. but it is unclear as to what and who they received training from.

ATR's are an alternative to custodial sentences and we are forerunners in this area.

Workforce Training needs a planned training development on alcohol.

Substance misuse is priority in Children's Plan however alcohol training has stopped.

The issue now is how we take forward. NST are returning on 21 August to find out how we feel and what we will do with the recommendations.

Concerns were raised on the number of places alcohol can be purchased. As an example the meeting was told in the Millfield area there used to be 18 places which sold alcohol, this has risen to 63.

The group was asked if Brian should be part of the Alcohol Violent Crime Task Group.

It was generally felt that there are laws but it's how these laws can be enforced consistently.

## **Item 6. Fire Service & Health and Wellbeing**

Sean Brown told the group how the Fire Service has a community focus when it is out among the general public. The service also goes out to specific groups. The group was also told the Fire Service is very much linked into N133 and NI47.

The governments green paper spoke of funding care of older people. It was felt that the partnerships need to get involved so should this be an item on the next agenda for discussion on how we are going to fund our future care, however it was asked that the structure of groups be revisited to it could be identified where this would sit within GPP

SH reported to the meeting that there is a proposed half day workshop in September with OLO's invited to discuss annual plans, work, governance and how to build on the work already completed. The group was asked to pass on their thoughts and also feed into this meeting the feelings of other groups.
