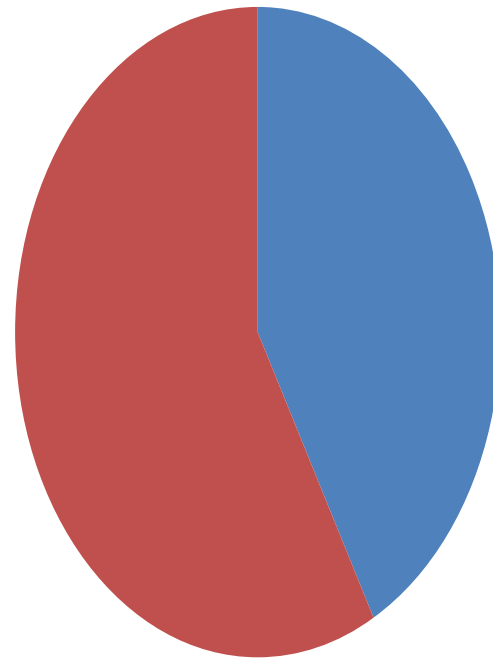

How would you rate this year's Forum?

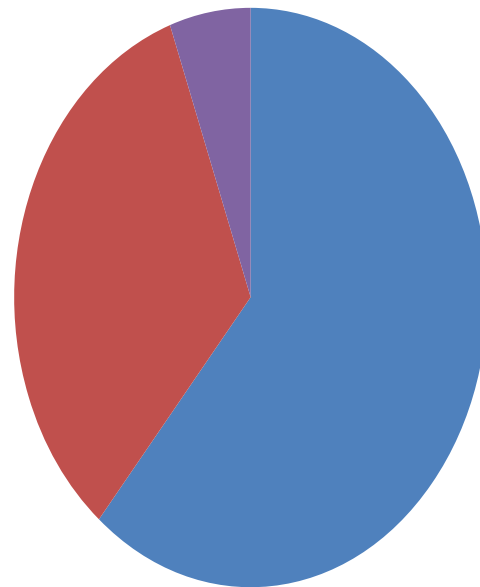

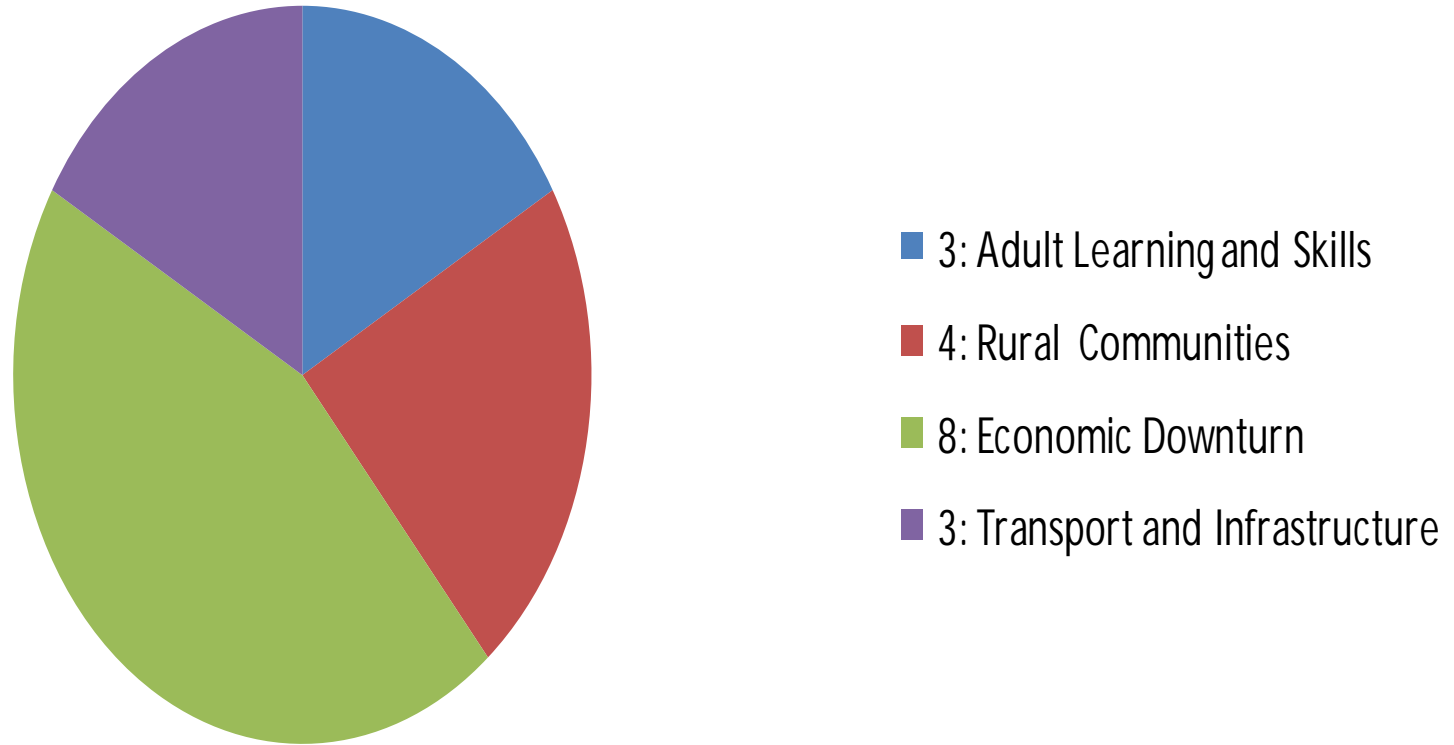

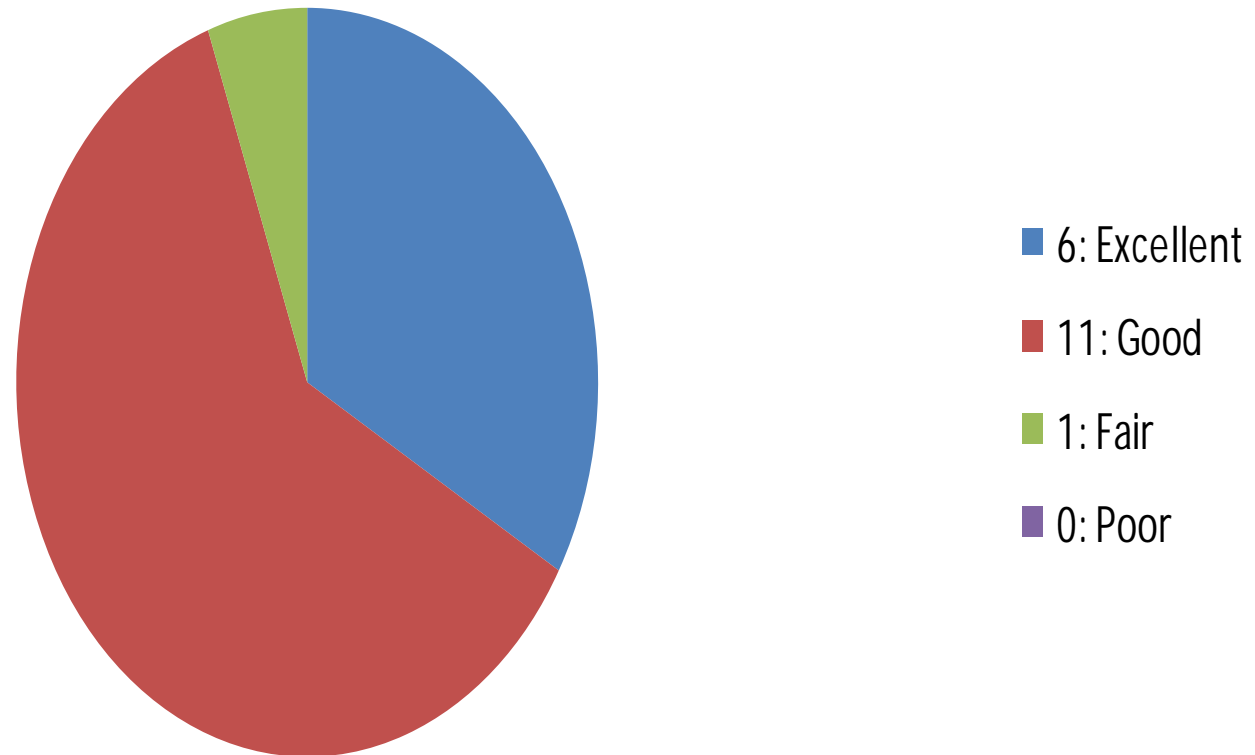

- Action 1:
Working together to identify and address common barriers to learning for those most vulnerable.

- Action 2
Proactively support the growth and ongoing development of the university as a regional offer
LEAD: University Centre Peterborough
- Action 3 - ESOL
Common approach to ESOL for adults and teaching assistants.
